# Organizing Committee Ste Anne's Hospital New Year's Eve Show 2020 Simon McDonaugh Humanitarian Award Recipient



Built in 1917, Ste Anne's Hospital was one of the nine hospitals established in Canada by the Military Hospitals Commission under the Borden government, to respond to an unprecedented influx of the sick and wounded generated by the First World War.

On April 1, 2016, this last hospital administered by Veterans Affairs Canada was transferred to the Quebec government.

For more than 70 years now, a New Year's Eve show has been organized by veterans and members of the community for those housed at the veterans' hospital in Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue. One of the key organizers for over 65 of these shows was the late Joe Mell.

The event's volunteers come from all corners of the community. In fact, the UIS Entertainment Committee at one time volunteered its time for this most worthy show. Members and former members alike continue the committee's great work.

For the committee's quiet dedication to this great cause and for the joy the event brings to the Hospital's resident Veterans, whose average age exceeds 93, the United Irish Societies of Montreal is humbled to present the 2020 Simon McDonaugh Humanitarian Award to the Organizing Committee of the Ste Anne's Hospital New Year's Eve Show.



#### Solstice 2020 Liam Daly Heritage Award Recipient



Solstice is one of Canada's most exciting and prolific Celtic folk bands. Based in Montreal, Solstice has been delighting audiences across North America and Europe for over a decade with their explosive live performances showcasing their unique brand of Celtic folk that incorporates elements of Bluegrass and Canadian maritime music. The band is comprised of Patrick Lesyk on acoustic guitar and lead vocals, Kate Bevan-Baker on fiddle, and Dave Gossage on flutes and whistles. Patrick is well-known for his dynamic and percussive guitar accompaniments, but it's his warm and soulful voice that is most recognized as being both powerful and sensitive. Kate's fiddle is electrifying, yet also moving and emotive. Dave never fails to wow audiences with his wizardry on the flute and whistles. The success of the band is largely due to their impressive performance dexterity and musical sensibility which allow them to appeal to a wide range of audiences, making them a mainstay in the Canadian music scene.

For their contributions and dedication to Montreal's Irish community, the United Irish Societies of Montreal is pleased to present Solstice as the recipient of the 2020 Liam Daly Heritage Award.



#### Patty-Ann McCann 2021 Simon McDonaugh Humanitarian Award Recipient



Most in the community will recognize Patty-Ann McCann as thelong-time VicePresident – Organization for the UIS, a role she has filled with distinction since April 2011 after serving as Deputy Parade Director in 2010. She has served as a marshal since 1999 and even served as chairperson of the UIS Banquet Committee for the year 2000.

While Patty's United Irish Societies' activities are wonderful and appreciated, her selection as the recipient of this award is in large part due to her extensive involvement with the Girl Guide movement.

Patty joined Brownies in Montreal's Notre-Dame-de Grace neighbourhood at St Augustine Church at the age of seven and has subsequently been involved with the Girl Guides of Canada for 35 years and counting. After moving out west, Patty was a Guide Leader in Banffand Canmore, Alberta and upon her return, in Pincourt and Dorval, Quebec. She was privileged to take a patrol to Camp 101 in Roscommon, Ireland which coincidentally involved 101 Canadian Girl Guides. Patty has participated in two interprovincial camps, one being in Smithers, BC and the other in Guelph, Ontario.

She is proud of having had a positive impact on hundreds of girls, including her daughter, Victoria who has continued the tradition of empowering girls through the Girl Guides of Canada for almost 20 years of her 26 years of life.

For her quiet volunteerism and for her dedication to the empowerment of girls, the United Irish Societies of Montreal is pleased to present Patty-Ann McCann with the 2021 Simon McDonaugh Humanitarian Award. We are certain her associates with the Girl Guides of Canada concur with this selection.



#### Paul Loftus 2021 Liam Daly Heritage Award Recipient



Paul was born and raised in Ireland in a town known for its annual Salmon Festival, a town called Ballina in County Mayo. He settled in Canada in 1971. His name first popped up in the United Irish Societies archives in 1973, when he was named a delegate to the UIS from the Montreal Irish Rugby Football Club (MIRFC). Clearly, he quickly got busy building relationships. Like many Irish Immigrants, Paul gravitated to the Montreal Shamrocks Gaelic Athletic Club and was captain of the team for a time. He also played rugby with the MIRFC, even serving as president. He has served as a St. Patrick's Society director, was president and co-founder of the Ireland-Canada Chamber of Commerce and presided over the UIS for the 2018 and 2019 parades. Speaking of parades, Paul was also honoured in 2012 when he served as Grand Marshal, joining a very long list of distinguished individuals and the first Irish-born Grand Marshal since Dr. Michael Kenneally was honoured in 2003.

What makes this award so special, and I am sure he will concur, is that Paul co-hosted the Irish Show on CF Cable 9 and Videotron "with" Liam Daly. He and Liam were often seen around the reviewing stand at Phillips Square in the early to mid-1990s after they had completed the live broadcast for the shut-ins and those otherwise unable to head downtown for the annual celebration.

It is special enough when an Irish-born person engrained in Montreal is selected to receive this award, but it is even a more memorable occasion when an Irish-born person who knew and worked with Liam is chosen. It is the pleasure of The United Irish Societies of Montreal to present Paul Loftus the 2021 Liam Daly Heritage Award.



## Sterling Downey 2022 Simon McDonaugh Humanitarian Award Recipient



Sterling has always positioned himself as a force for change. After co-founding the UnderPressure Urban Arts Festival in 1996, he opened collaborative spaces created for and by the emerging street art community. There is more to Sterling, however. Sterling was first elected city councillor for the Desmarchais-Crawford district in his Verdun in 2013. This is where I believe many in the United Irish Societies were introduced to Sterling.

Sterling has never shied away from his past as a skinhead in his younger years. While he did not let his past define him, he has used his experiences to help marginalized youth by speaking about the effects of bullying and by helping communities such as LGBTQ2S youth find safe spaces where they can thrive.

While helping youth is a big part of who Sterling is, he is also committed to recognizing and honouring his community's veterans past and present. Sterling was a major proponent of the recently inaugurated "Sentier des coquelicots" (translated: Poppy Trail) in the Crawford Park neighbourhood he has called home the entirety of his life. Despite being occasionally in an election campaign, he always finds the time to volunteer his services to sell poppies within his community for Royal Canadian Legion Branch #4.

On a personal level, Sterling's involvement in the Polar Bear Plunge with Luc Gagnon was the motivation for some UIS members to also raise money and jump into the frigid St. Lawrence River for the benefit of Special Olympics Quebec.

For his quiet dedication to numerous youth and veterans initiatives, and for the positive impact he has had on countless youth and veterans in his community, it is our pleasure to award Sterling Downey the 2022 Simon McDonaugh Humanitarian Award

Gold Card Membership in recognition of a lifetime of loyal and faithful service to the United Irish Societies and to the annual St. Patrick's Day Parade. The memory of Mr. McDonaugh's humanitarian lifestyle lives on through this award.

#### Colleen Murphy 2022 Liam Daly Heritage Award Recipient

According to a March 17, 1994 Montreal Gazette article, Colleen stated "Being chosen was quite a surprise." In fact, Colleen was a reluctant applicant to the pageant, as the event was then called. Apparently, her friends sent for the application and then goaded her until she relented and applied. During the evening she spoke about the strong sense of family, faith, and history in the Irish community.

Following her reign Colleen quickly got to work on the pageant committee and, in the Spring of 1998 was named Chairperson of the Queen's Pageant, today is known as the Queen's Selection Evening. Other than the 2001 and 2003 selection evenings, Colleen has since chaired the event all while raising her family with her husband Ian Locke. The 2020 Queen's Selection Evening was Colleen's 20th as chairperson.

For her consistent support of the empowerment of young women of Irish birth or descent and for her long-standing promotion of "Montreal Irish" culture through her leadership in the Queen's Selection Evening, the United Irish Societies of Montreal is pleased to present Colleen Murphy the 2022 Liam Day Heritage Award.

The Liam Daly Heritage Award was created by the United Irish Societies of Montreal in memory of a man closely associated with numerous organizations within the Irish community and made a positive impact on those he served.



#### **EVERYONE LOVES A PARADE, DON'T THEY?**

Marchers, mascots, and music on Montreal streets in March (St. Catherine Street, of late) has been THE signal that Spring is upon us. It has been that way since 1824 when Michael O'Sullivan and friends from the Hibernian Society first organized a public demonstration of Irish pride and it is widely accepted that this went on in an uninterrupted fashion, until 2020. Never did Mother Nature or other circumstance best the Parade, though there were a number of close calls. In a climate such as ours, this is a testament to the sturdiness of our community members and parade participants and the importance of the Parade to the community.

What took us down was an invisible and formidable foe - COVID. Quebec society essentially came to a screeching halt on Thursday, March 12, 2020 when Quebec Premier François Legault declared a state of emergency. Despite the government edict the intent was to have a parade before the end of calendar year 2020 when circumstances permitted, according to Vice President - Advertising & Public Relation Kevin Tracey, who stated "We will have a parade before the calendar year is up, and it won't be at Christmas". Montreal Mayor Valerie Plante tweeted "The party isn't cancelled, it's merely post-poned".<sup>2</sup>

Irish community members are not easily deterred. On March 15, 2020, the date the Mass of Anticipation was scheduled to take place, a small but enthusiastic group led by Victor Boyle and Fergus Keyes marched around some streets in Point St. Charles. The same group marched safely on the sidewalks of Point St. Charles on March 14, 2021.

Following the initial shock of society grinding to a halt, members of the community soon got back at it ensuring that good works within the community continued. Meetings were taking place virtually on such platforms as Microsoft Teams and ZOOM, which allowed the less mobile the chance to participate yet also is perceived to prevent those without technology from participating. The benefits of holding meetings virtually far outweighed the barriers they may have created.

Technology was also used to raise money for the community. Though their American Thanksgiving fundraiser was cancelled in 2020 and 2021, members of the Erin Sports Association and their friends used social media to raise funds to support their Christmas activities. St. Patrick's Society produced virtual luncheons in 2021 and 2022, a charity golf tournament in September 2021, but cancelled their charity balls in 2021 and 2022.

Within the United Irish Societies, giving back at Christmas has been a tradition since 1967. With a November, 2020 national unemployment rate at 8.9% <sup>3</sup> it was clear the organization needed to do its part. Using technology and social media the organization raised funds in 2020 and 2021 to provide Christmas baskets for a greater number of families than a normal year, with special thanks to many of the organization's 2020 Banquet Program advertisers who agreed to roll the funds paid towards an advertisement into the Christmas fund.

Like a phoenix rising from the ashes, the United Irish Societies organized a small early morning marchers-only parade on March 20, 2022, just as Michael O'Sullivan and friends had done in 1824. The day prior, members of the Soulanges Irish Society held their 2022 Irish Festival and on March 26th, members of the Chateauguay and Valley Irish Heritage Association paraded through Chateauguay.

Hopefully 2023 brings more normalcy to our lives for next year marks 200 years of St. Patrick's Parades in Montreal and, well, everyone loves a parade, don't they?




